INTRODUCTION

This report gives an overview on the start of the school year and its length as well as the timing and length of school holidays. It covers both primary and general secondary education. The information is available for the 37 countries participating in the EU's Erasmus+ programme (27 EU Member States, Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Switzerland, Iceland, Liechtenstein, Montenegro, North Macedonia, Norway, Serbia and Türkiye). The reference year is 2023/2024.

KEY POINTS

The school year generally starts at the beginning of September

In most of the European education systems, the school year starts in September. It starts on 1 September in 11 education systems ⁽¹⁾. Students in Malta are the last to return to school at the end of September. In eight education systems, school starts in August ⁽²⁾. It may start as early as 9 August in Finland.

The length of the summer holidays varies a lot across Europe

In Europe, the summer holidays generally start between the end of May and the second half of July. In the majority of the education systems, students have between 8 and 12 weeks.

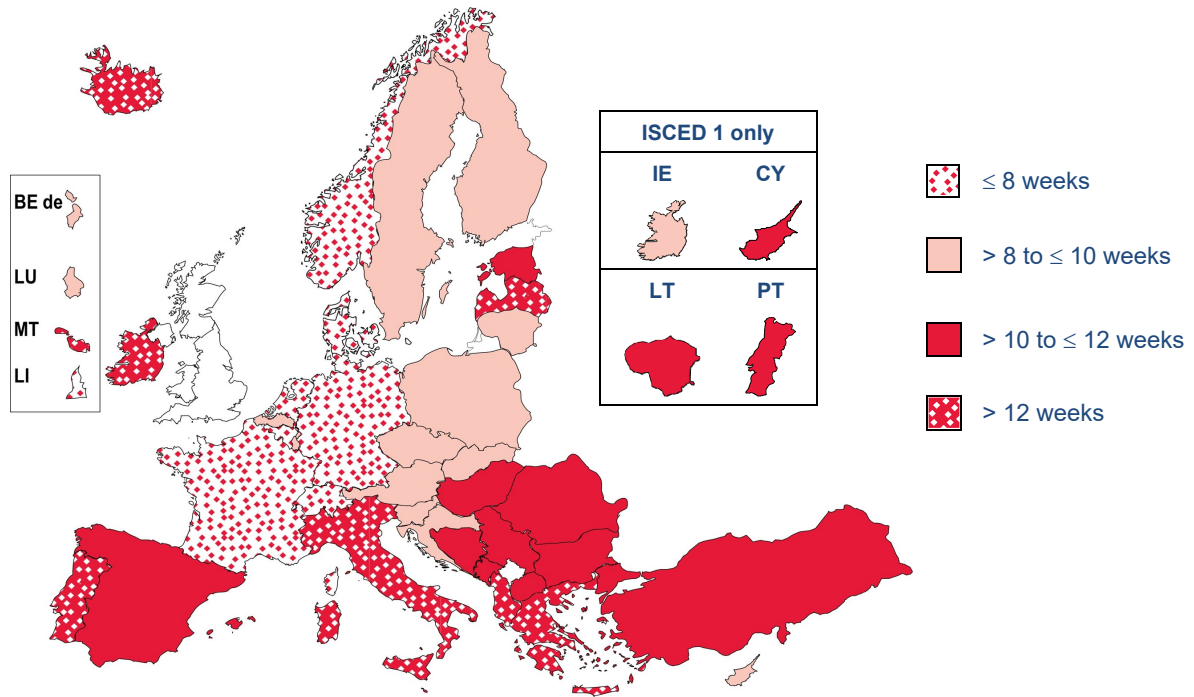
However, the length of the summer holidays varies significantly between countries (see Figure 1). They last no more than 8 weeks in the French Community of Belgium, Denmark, some German *Länder*, France, the Netherlands, some Swiss cantons, Liechtenstein and Norway. At the opposite end, students are on holidays for more than 12 weeks in Ireland (ISCED 2 and 3), Greece, Latvia, Malta, Portugal (ISCED 2), Albania, Iceland (ISCED 2-3), and in most regions in Italy.

In some countries, the length of the summer holidays varies depending on the level of education. In Lithuania, students in primary education have two more weeks than those in general secondary education. In three countries, students in primary education have more holidays than those in general secondary education. They may have one month more in Portugal (depending on grade), two more weeks in Lithuania, and one and a half week more in Cyprus; Conversely, students in general secondary education have longer summer holidays. In Iceland they have two weeks less and in Ireland about four weeks less.

(2) In the French Community of Belgium, Denmark, Finland, Sweden, Switzerland, Iceland, Liechtenstein and Norway. It may also be the case in Germany, Ireland and the Netherlands depending on the region or the school.

Country-specific notes

Belgium (Flemish Community): the data has not been validated by the Eurydice National Unit.

Spain, Croatia, Italy, Malta and Portugal: the exact dates for the start of the school year in 2024/2025 are not yet available. The summer period is calculated with the assumption that students will come back to school at the same period as in 2023/2024.

Portugal: In the last two grades of ISCED 3, the duration can be 8 weeks or less.

Iceland: the map shows the category for ISCED 3. For ISCED 1 and 2, the duration is between 10 and 12 weeks.

Figure 2: Length of the school year and distribution of holidays in primary and general education (ISCED 1-3), 2023/2024

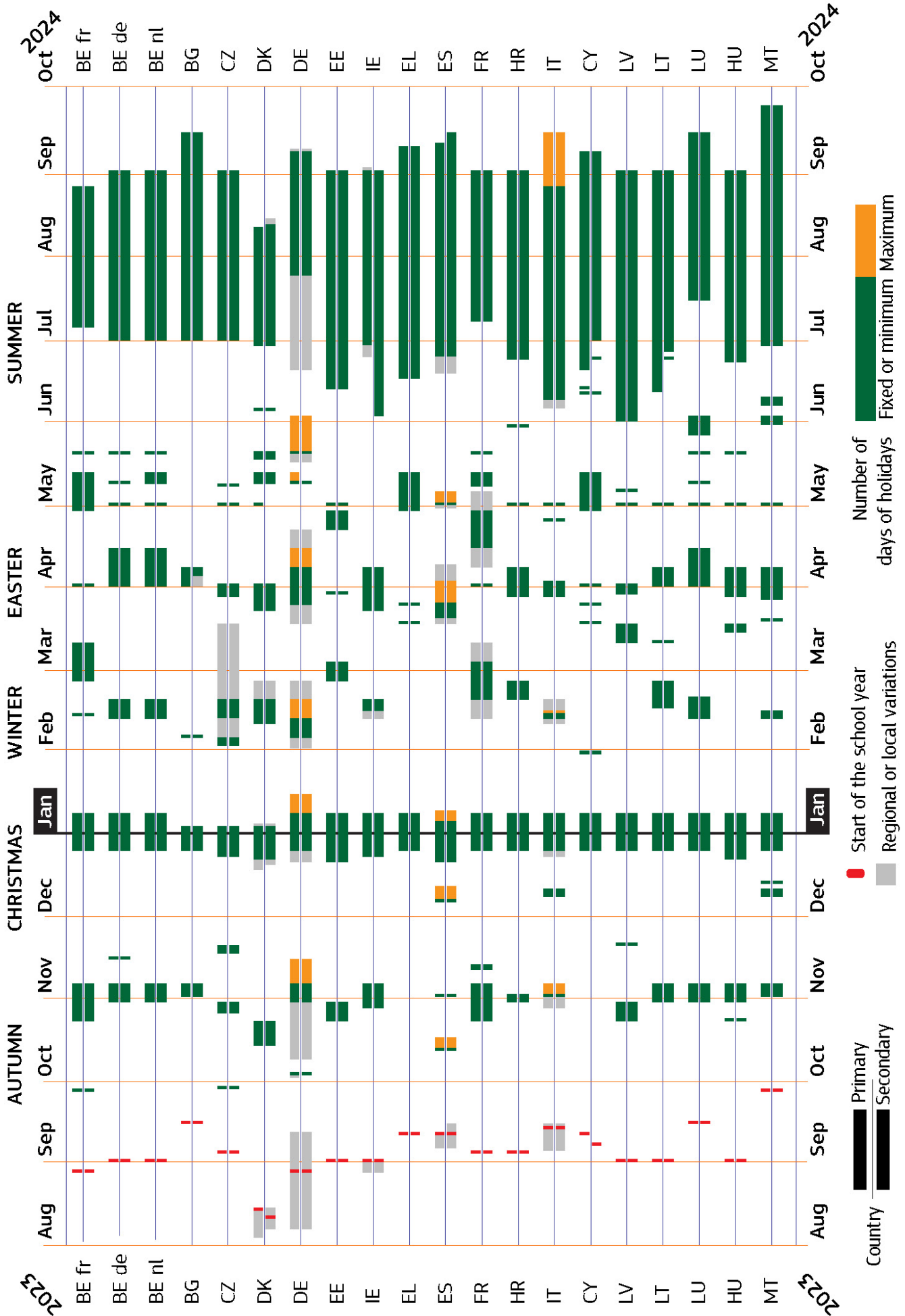
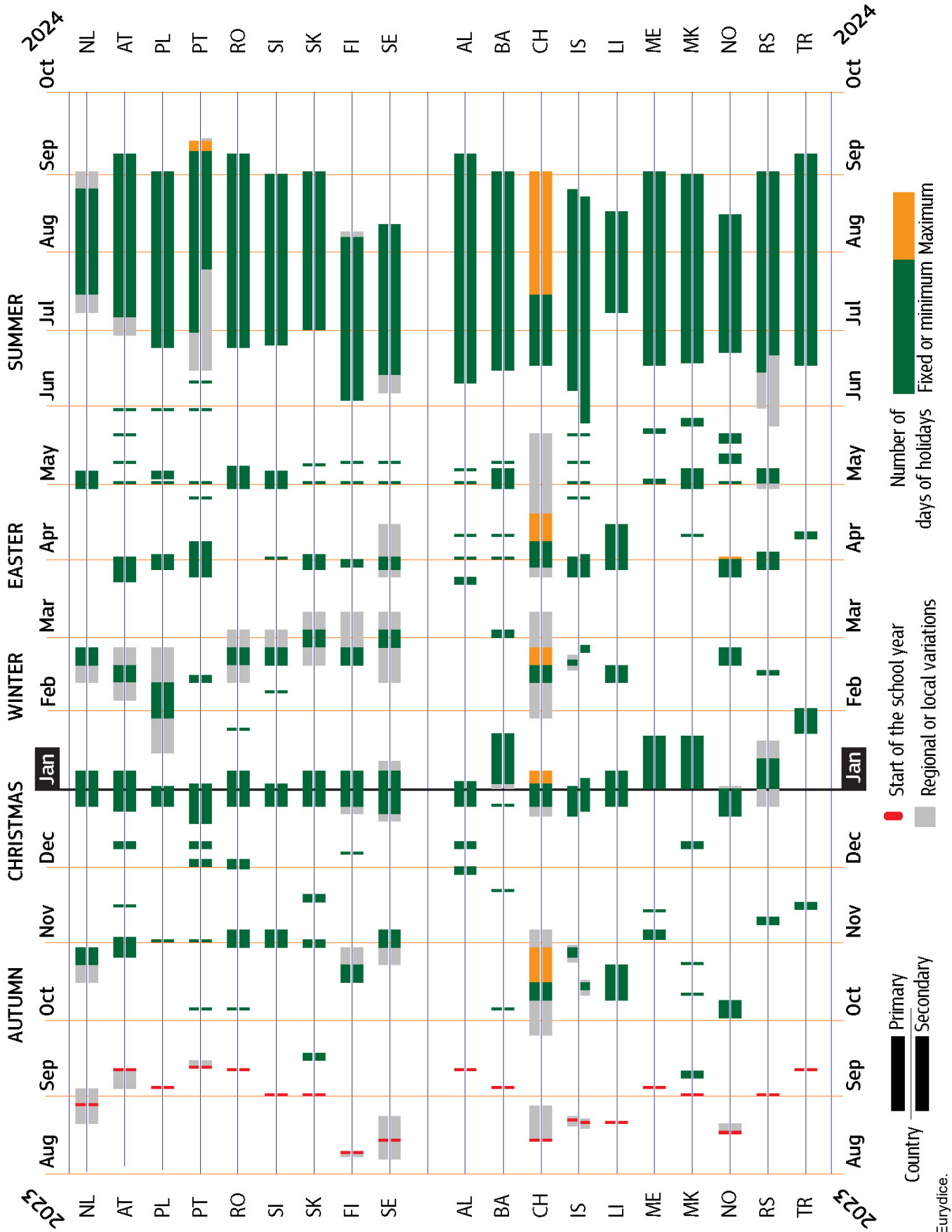


Figure 2 (continued): Length of the school year and distribution of holidays in primary and general education (ISCED 1-3), 2023/2024

Beginning of the school year: the first day when students are meant to resume school activities, usually after the longest holiday period. It is the day that is indicated in official documents even if it is not an instruction day.

Holiday period: days when students are not required to be present at school (compared to usual school week). This includes public holidays. Examination periods (even if taken outside the schools), school trips when some or all students are not present at school are not considered, even if only some students are required to attend.

When there is a holiday period immediately before a weekend, the days of the weekend that follows are included as part of the holiday period.

When a holiday period lasts for a week or more, the weekends during the holiday period and at the end of the holiday period are included. However, the weekend before is not included even if the holiday period is starting on a Monday.

The figure does not take into account specific minimum number of days for students in the final grade of an education cycle.

Longer holiday periods for specific regions or tracks, indicated as 'maximum duration' in Figure 3, are not considered.
